
Some solid tools for working with multiple kinds of media on the Mac

<u>Telestream's ScreenFlow (Mac only)</u> – for entry-level to advanced users






Mac

- Apple Silicon + Intel-based¹ Mac² with 64-bit processor Core i3+ recommended
- Operating Systems
 - macOS Big Sur 11

- Minimum 4 GB RAM
- 20 GB hard drive
- Apple macOS approved graphics card^{3,4,5} required
- Cameras using the HDV codec are not supported

Digital audio:


- Garageband (FREE comes installed on new Macs)
 - o Create your own music, background tracks, voiceovers



- Adobe Audition CC audio recording and editing software
- Audacity (free) audio recording and editing software

Other multimedia:

<u>Book Creator</u>
(I haven't used this but have seen it mentioned numerous times; could be a solid tool for the storytellers and artists out there.)



Other streaming:

• Telestream Wirecast

(I haven't used this tool/setup, but I like Telestream's SrceenFlow app that much. The design is far more intuitive, user-friendly, yet powerful. As such, I'd at least look at this tool as a possibility.)
